On the first day we had been invited to a reception in the Attlee Room of the House of Lords along with a number of other quests including our International President, Barry Palmer, and his wife Anne. This was to hear a presentation by Lord Loomba CBE on behalf of his own Charity, the Loomba Foundation. This Foundation is currently promoting its project to empower widows in India by providing them with sewing machines. Our International President, along with senior Lions from within our Multiple District, has agreed to a partnership with the Loomba Foundation to provide sewing machines for this initiative - more details will be released shortly to all Clubs throughout our Multiple District.

The second event was the annual Lions and UN Day held in Committee Room 14 of the House of Commons. As always this was an extremely well attended event with Lions from across our Multiple District where we had the opportunity to hear a number of speakers including PDG Roger Handcock on how the link with UN days and the Palace of Westminster came about, the broadcaster Sue MacGregor CBE who as a trustee of UNICEF talked about the many links which exist between UNICEF and Lions, Mary Ware of Help2Read outlined the new partnership with Lions to empower young people in Malawi to become more self reliant and, of course, our International President. To round off this most interesting and informative day I had been given the honour to propose the Vote of Thanks to our speakers – a challenging but really rewarding opportunity and one which will remain as one of those defining moments in a year of so many such occasions.

Last Lionistic year, Lion President Terry Cheesman had a dream to install a defibrillator in our club's area. This followed learning about one being placed in an unwanted telephone box in another part of the

country. Alas, we had no such telephone boxes in Hook, but the club decided to find an alternative site in Hook. The South Central Ambulance Service were contacted and they came to the club to talk about defibrillators and suitable The Parish Council were approached and were sites. delighted with our offer to purchase the equipment. Indeed they were happy to supply the board to mount it on and agreed that we could use their electricity supply. The defibrillator and case were ordered and Lion Graham, a certified electrician was ready to do the necessary electrical connections. The site chosen was near the main shops in Hook, an area well known to all Hook residents, should they need to find it in an emergency, and near a power supply owned by the Parish Council. Then came the problems as outlined in the News paper article!

Eventually all the questions were answered and the defibrillator was in place and Terry's dream was partially fulfilled. Partially, because he wants to provide more for our other villages, in our area. The club are with him on this, and await the results of discussions with South Central Ambulance, as the next best venue for positioning another one.

We do not know how many people this will save but if only one person is helped by this initiative the club will be very satisfied that it's money has been well spent.

The defibrillator case has our name and logo on it so it is probably the best PR that we could wish for in Hook

The morning of Convention started with District Governor David Merchant with Lions and their partners welcoming the International Guests Past International President Jim Ervin, a member of Albany Lions Club, Georgia, USA and Past International Director Phil Nathan. Following the opening ceremony a short act of remembrance was held to commemorate Lions who have passed to higher service in the last 12 months.

Lion Mike Hendy was formally nomination for District Governor 2014/15, Lion Alan Chapman nominated as 1st Vice District Governor and Lions David Taylor and Peter Burnett nominated for 2nd Vice District Governor 2014/15. Each candidate outlined their plans for the coming year if successful at the ballot.

Past International President Jim Ervin gave an enthralling talk to Convention inspiring members to promote club growth and Lions membership.

On the close of the morning session the ballot boxes opened and the Lions dispersed to 3 Convention Workshop sessions to discuss plans to commemorate the centenary of Lions Clubs International in 3 years time.

The afternoon session began with Past International Director Phil Nathan giving a presentation about the Lions Europa Form which is being held in Birmingham from 30th October to 2nd November this year. He explained how the Europa Forum gives the opportunity for the members of Lions Clubs from all over Europe and guests from all nations worldwide to share ideas and experiences and learn from each other. Awards and certificates of appreciation were presented prior to the adoption of reports from the various district teams and committees. The Lions Wives and partners returned to the Convention Room. This year's Young Ambassador Award winner Jenny Russ sponsored by Jersey Lions Club was introduced to Convention. She gave an inspiring presentation about the work she carries out in the community helping those in need. Past International President Jim Ervin formally presented the Young Ambassador Award Trophy to Jenny as Convention gave her a standing ovation.

A proportion of the District Competition Awards were presented with some being held over until the Sunday morning Forum to save time.

The Keynote Speech was then given by Brian Higgins from the charity 'Missing People' which is supported by Lion Diana Merchant as this year's DG partner's designated charity. Brian spoke about 'Missing People' being the only charity dedicated to bringing missing children and adults back to their families. He detailed the support given 24 hours a day, 7 days a week by their dedicated team. A cheque for £2674.05 was then presented by Lion Diana.

The result of the ballot for next District Governor, the First and Second Vice District Governors was announced and District Governor elect Mike Hendy, 1st Vice District Governor Alan Chapman and 2nd Vice District Governor David Taylor went to the stage to address Convention.

The host Committee led by PDG Fred Massey was thanked for their hard work.

Next year's Convention Host Committee dressed in seaside regalia paraded into the hall to publicise the 2015 District Convention to be held at the Wessex Hotel, Bournemouth from 20th to 22nd March next year.

A summary of the day was given by Past International President Jim Ervin before the traditional closing ceremony. To compliment the formal convention business Saturday was rounded off with an impressive Banquet and Ball which enabled all attending to enjoy each other's company in the true spirit of Lionism.

The Sunday morning Forum had Cabinet Members in attendance to review the discussions held at the Convention Workshops 24 hours earlier on ideas and plans for the Lions Centenary from July 2016 to December 2017. British Wireless for the Blind Fund's spokesperson David Loveridge said: "I really want to thank members of



Weymouth the & Portland Lions who have given up their time to raise money which has allowed us to provide blind and partially sighted people Weymouth in and

Portland with specially modified radios. These unique audio devices allow the recipient to listen to talking books and newspapers, CD, cassettes, digital radio and much more. They are designed so that it is easier to use for those with sight loss, meaning independent use on a daily basis. We know from feedback from existing recipients of our radio sets that having the loan of a specially adapted radio can make a difference to blind and partially sighted people's lives by keeping them informed, occupied and entertained.

January, Meon Vallev In Lions Club once again supported the Ford Charity Open Sea Fishing Festival on Weston Shore. Southampton, managing the

event set-up, marshalling and weigh-in. Despite the much-publicised closure of the Ford Transit plant, the Sea Angling section of the Sports and Social club is still very active, as it approaches its 40th year promoting this great fund-raising event.

Remarkably, given the atrocious coastal weather we have seen in 2014, we were blessed with blue skies and relatively fine conditions on the day. In total we had 117 senior competitors and 11 juniors participating this year and through entry fees, a raffle and some rounding-up from our own funds, we now plan to make a £1,250 charity donation to the Naomi House/Jack's Place Hospice charity in Winchester.

The overall prize winner this year was Neil Wetherby from Southampton with a catch totalling 2lb 2oz. Second



atch totalling 21b 2oz. Second place was Ant Buik from Dorchester (11b 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ oz) and third was local fisherman Shaun Royal (11b 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ oz).

We will be formally presenting the cheque to representatives of Naomi House at the prize-giving ceremony in March, bringing the amount

raised from this and previous years' involvement in the Fishing festival to around £37,000. It's a great result and our thanks go to the Ford Sea Angling section of the Sports and Social club, the Transport and General Workers Union and all the fishermen for their support.
