Grateful thanks must also go to those Lions who gave freely of their time and effort to be with the youngsters at the Camp: Lions John Apps (Camp Director), Frances Bond, Ron and Ann Twinning, Lynden McIntyre and Richard High - without their commitment there would have been no Youth Camp in our District. The PGL staff who provided the expertise and a most impressive variety of activities must be recognised for their efforts as well. Deep felt thanks must also go to those Clubs who arranged activities on Wednesday and Friday away from the Camp and thus gave the youngsters the opportunity to explore more of this part of our District, its history and its culture.



I visited the Camp, along with Diana, on Thursday and in addition to joining the teams for lunch we were able to watch a range of activities including street surfing, fencing, aeroball and watch full use being made of the climbing wall. Saturday we joined everyone at the impressive National Sailing Academy in Portland (built for 2012 Olympics)



where the teams were able to compete against each other in a series of 'dragon boat' races. Saturday evening saw the traditional

Gala Dinner, well organised by Wareham Lions, where after an excellent meal and the wonderful company of young people, we were entertained by the youngsters themselves. On a personal note Diana and I were surprised and delighted to receive a card signed by the whole group in recognition of our Wedding Anniversary celebrated during the Camp – a touching moment to end a truly memorable experience.

One particular point of note was the camaraderie and teamwork on display throughout the period of the Camp. This was testament to the willingness of these young people to join in fully with the opportunities available and who showed complete faith and trust in the PGL staff and our own Lions. I am sure each one of them has many special memories to treasure and will have made friendships, some of which could last a lifetime.



We enjoyed a wonderful day at Goodwood races, even if the weather was certainly not in our favour! We were joined by Lions from Districts A and SE; again an idea from PDG Pat Nixon, and what a truly memorable occasion this turned out to be with nearly 600 Lions and friends savouring this new event on our District Calendar. This was a novel experience for many of those attending and the opportunity to meet up with Lions from 3 Districts at such an event was certainly something not to be missed.



The weather was much kinder on Bank Holiday Monday when I visited the River Itchen; Diana and I spent some time with the Lions of Southampton Solent and Swanwick. The occasion was their annual Duck

Race and they also took the opportunity, with support from a number of other Lions from our District, to promote themselves and our wonderful organisation. There were plenty of visitors to watch their ducks make their way along the river and it was most pleasing to see our current Young Ambassador, Jake, and his family, still supporting Lions and in their canoes rounding up the ducks and keeping them moving.

We hope to attend as many different events throughout the District as possible, in addition to our Official Visits and attendance at Charter Anniversaries.
