1. Europa Forum.

The 64th Europa Forum will be held in Scopje on 25th to 27th October 2018 hosted by our colleagues in District 132 Macedonia, at the Macedonian Philharmonic and will follow the theme *"Awareness & Empathy"*.

3. Freedom Kit Bags.

A very big thank you to those Clubs who have so far contributed to our new District International Project in support of the charity Freedom Kit Bags. Contributions to the end of February totalled £3,175.00 including a sum of £900.00 received from four clubs in District 105C. This sum, sufficient to finance 127 Kit Bags was paid to the charity in the first week of March.

The Trustees of FKB have recently returned from Nepal following an eight-week tour. I have received an update via a brief telephone conversation from which I understand that their visit was extremely successful with several important developments in the offing that they wish to explore with us. They were able to make contact with two Lions Clubs in the area both of whom wish to be involved and are keen to work with us that I am exploring further.

This is an ongoing District Project that will continue to enhance the lives of girls and women in the poorest areas of Nepal that will be developed further in the coming months. In the meantime the funding for more "Kit Bags" is the priority. If your Club has not contributed so far can you please consider doing so? Whatever the amount it will be greatly appreciated!
