You donated in excess of £38700 to the Philippines, which includes sufficient funds within the MD part of the appeal for 64 of the jerry cans which convert dirty water to clean drinking water and over £5380 to the Syrian appeal. This latter appeal was to provide 'school in a box' packs for the children of Syria and this figure will be matched by our own government following their pledge on all donations received before the end of January. A record number of swimmers made a Christmas Day splash for charity in the Lions annual Harbour Swim. The weather stayed kind as a total of 249 people took the plunge in the annual cross-harbour swim The popular event organised by the Weymouth and Portland Lions



Club began 65 years ago as a bet between two local publicans and has been run by the Lions since 1978. The event has grown to such an extent that each swim has to be limited to 50 and this year saw five separate swims.

The swimmers raised £10,518 for a variety of national and local charities including Westfield School

- Kids with Autism £1,800.00, £1,000 for the RNLI, £1,000 The Alzheimers Society and £1,000 to 'Alive and Well'. Lions also made a street collection which, along with the registration fees added £2,000 to the clubs charity fund

A little seed bears fruit





When International President Wing-Kun Tam asked Lions throughout the world to plant trees. Newbury Past President, Lion Colin Mansell, approached local councils to see what could be done. The Town Council in nearby Thatcham were considering developing a community orchard, but plans hadn't got very far. Since then, with the promise of a small financial contribution from the Lions Club of Newbury, the scheme has gathered pace and attracted other funding. In partnership with the Bucks, Berks and Oxfordshire wildlife trust and Thatcham Town Council, Newbury Lions have been involved in the project development which has finally come to fruition. A fruiting hedge surrounds the orchard and fruit trees native to Berkshire have been planted. Lion Colin planted a William's Bon Chretien pear tree on behalf of the club, aided by Lion Peter Collicot and Lion Derek Lawrence. The Community Orchard was officially opened by the Mayor of Thatcham aided by Newbury Lions President, Judith Colby.

LIONS YOUNG AMBASSADOR 105D Finals

Over the weekend of 10th and 11th of January 2014 the 105D district finals of the Young Ambassador Award were held at the Hinton Firs Hotel in Bournemouth. There were five clubs represented, Eastleigh, Cosham, Hythe and Waterside, Petersfield, and Jersey.



On Friday the five candidates arrived at the hotel around 5.00pm and at 6.30 we assembled in the Dorset Lounge for introductions. Each candidate was introduced by their sponsoring Lions Club then each gave short presentation about themselves and the thing that they are

doing within their communities. It was obvious right from the start that the panel of judges would have a very difficult task in deciding who would represent the district at the MD Finals in February, such was the high quality of the youngster's work. The draw then took place to decide the order of the interviews the following morning. After dinner in the restaurant we were back in the Dorset Lounge for a Quiz, very ably presented by PDG Lion Pat Nixon. A close contest ensued and the team comprising of the candidates and the judges came out victorious.

The panel of judges started the interviews early on Saturday and we were fortunate enough to have last year's Young Ambassador, Jake Toomer, on hand to make sure the candidates were where they should be at the appropriate time. With all interviews completed the judges made their deliberations. After lunch in the restaurant it was back to the lounge for the results. The Chairman of the panel of judges, Peter Viney, congratulated all the candidates on the standard and quality of their contribution to society. It is always said on these occasions that there are no losers because all these young people are winners in their own right. The judges had decided that the



candidate to represent District 105D at the Multiple District Finals was to be Jenny Russ sponsored by the Lions Club of Jersey. Present to share her celebrations were Lion Mike Labey and Lion Brian Bullock along with Jenny's mum Rebecca. However all the candidates agreed that it did not matter who had won they all appreciated the opportunity that this weekend has given them to

mix with like-minded young people and exchange a few ideas.

Thanks were given to the judging panel Peter Viney, Julie Mackay and Andy Salter. Thanks were also given to District Governor Lion David Merchant and Lion Diana Merchant for their support throughout the weekend.

During the interview period on Saturday morning we held an Open Forum where many ideas were thrown open for discussion. The candidates were included in this and were very forthcoming with their ideas and suggestions. One such suggestion was that all the young people who were present may like to accompany their sponsoring Lions Club to their Zone Meeting and so try to spread the word from their perspective about the Young Ambassador competition. We need to encourage more Lions Clubs to become involved with this competition. Even the youngsters could see that only five clubs from some sixty three clubs was a poor rate of support.

Another point discussed was the timing of our District Finals. We had planned to move the finals weekend to December to try to avoid the exam times in January. As these exams are not now to be held in January it was suggested that we continue to hold them as we are. We are also able to revert to holding them over a Saturday and Sunday thus easing the pressure to get to Bournemouth on a Friday afternoon. The outcome of this is that the District 105D Young Ambassador Finals next year will be at the Hinton Firs Hotel, Bournemouth on Saturday and Sunday 10th and 11th January 2015.
