Is your Santa FOR THE ANNUAL STRE **COLLECTIONS?**

If so, the following small print will be of

Please remember there is no insurance cover provided by the Lions' Insurance Programme for any motor vehicle. If a vehicle is being used to tow your Christmas float then it is necessary to ensure that the private or commercial motor insurance attaching to that vehicle has been extended to cover the towing risk.

It is possible to arrange short period cover in some situations via our Insurance Brokers (Miles Smith) for example, in the case of hired vehicles, when towing vehicles is excluded or when the towing vehicle's own insurance policy has restricted drivers or when the Club does not wish for the owner's own motor insurance policy to be affected by a negligent claim whilst the owner is undertaking an activity on behalf of the Club. The cover is issued by request and is subject to a separate premium. If you require a quotation please make direct contact with Miles Smith. Our contacts are Margaret Chandler and Annie Morse at lionsclub @ milessmith.co.uk.

The Lions Public Liability insurance does protect the legal liability of the Lions Club, its members and helpers for loss of or damage to third party property or third party injury caused by the Christmas Float while it is not being towed, for example when it is unhitched and static at a shopping

Please remember to prepare a written risk assessment for the Christmas float activities, in advance, and ensure that everyone involved is made aware of the risks identified and procedures. There is guidance in the Insurance Handbook which can be accessed via our District 105D website and covers the use of Santa floats.

I hope you have fun and raise lots of money with your float and all stay safe.

Are you hosting a Christmas Gift Fair or Table Top Sale?

Many Lions Clubs host Table Top Sales and Gift Fairs and 'sell' tables to small groups or individuals who make cards or craft items as a sideline and sell them for a small profit. These small groups or individuals do not always have their own Public/Product Liability Insurance in place. In these circumstances we can ask the Lions' Insurers to include them under the Lions Liability Insurance Policy for the period of the event. You will need to make contact with Margaret Chandler or Annie Morse at <u>li-</u> onsclub@milessmith.co.uk for approval.

Larger organisations (e.g. commercial traders and market traders) or charities taking 'tables' at Lions events must have their own Public and Product Liability insurance in place and they will need to provide written evidence of such insurance to your Lions Club's event organiser.

The Taste of Wickham Food Festival in September benefited from Indian summer weather, attracting around 4,000 people to this inaugural event. The organisers had done a great job, filling the village square with numerous local suppliers of every conceivable type of food and drink, as well as musicians and rolling cookery demonstrations.

The Meon Valley Lions Club worked in partnership with Tull's the local Wickham butcher to put on a barbecue right outside the butcher's shop. Between 11 am and 4 pm, no fewer than 700 burgers and sausages were dished up to the eager punters. That's a hot serving every 20 seconds! Wow! It was great work from a dedicated team who worked pretty much without a break from 9.00 am through to 4.00 pm.

We raised around £1,400 for our charity account from the day's efforts plus a further £100 collected in our donation buckets. Well done also to Lion Gary Pothecary who spent a lot of the day shuttling visitors from the car park to the town centre in the Meon Valley Lions Club minibus, covering many miles in the process.

A few weeks after the food festival we were back for seconds! We attended the Wickham Charity Beer Festival, which now attracts over five hundred real ale punters to the bi-annual events each spring and autumn. The October beer festival was the fourteenth that organisers Dave, Mike and Ashley have put on. They deserve a lot of credit for a great job in not only creating a brilliant community event, but also raising heaps of cash for local causes and charities in the process. This year the beneficiaries included outdoor therapy charity "God Unlimited" and "Nothing's Impossible", Ashley Wilson's own fund raising charity.

The two Lions' barbeques were busy all evening before we finally sold out just before last orders. It was our second best night for the beer festival in terms of food sales, raising over £700 for our charity fund. In the last year we reckoned we've served around over 7cwt (355kg) of sausages and burgers and as usual, the compliments came thick and fast from the beer festival regulars.

The Windsor Lions Annual Swimarathon is a major success

Almost 50 teams, that's more than 300 swimmers, swam on Sunday 14 October at Windsor Leisure Pool to raise money for their own good causes in what the Windsor Lions have described as a 'major fundraising success!'. More than £14,000 was raised on the day and more is expected as sponsorship moneys are collected.

Event records toppled as the swimmers ploughed up and down the pool, typically swimming in laps of two lengths over 55 minutes. With an amazing 91 laps swum, a Windsor Leisure Centre team broke the record for the number of laps swum and Team Archer, led by 10 years old Mason Archer raised a staggering £4,000 for a brain tumour charity, the highest ever for the event.

Event organiser Lion Mike Sells was delighted. "What a fantastic day! The energy and enthusiasm shown by the swimmers and their supporters alike created a wonderful atmosphere. Our objective for the event is to make fundraising possible for our local good causes and have fun doing it. We certainly achieved that as many local groups and charities are more than £14,000 better off with the promise of more to come.
