### 96 Christmas Food Parcels from the Lions

The annual delivery of Christmas food parcels to local people has been made again by Wimborne and Ferndown Lions Club.

Club members fill bags with about 25 food items from bulk supplies purchased from Morrisons of Verwood. In a well established process, stacks comprising 96 pieces of each food item are assembled on tables in the Scout Hut. Club members then circulate, filling the bags with one from each stack. The bags are then delivered to people most in need who have been notified to the Lions from local Social Services, CABs and GPs, etc.

This year the Club was ably assisted by Verwood's new Mayor, Mrs Pat Morrow, who took an active part in the bag-filling process.

## District 105D Global Membership Team (GMT)

The Global Membership Team or GMT is a name you've heard bandied about at the District Convention and perhaps at Zone meetings, but who are they and what exactly do they do?

The GMT is a Cabinet committee comprising of the District Governors' Team, Regional Club Development Team Specialists, Zone Chairmen and the District Marketing & PR Co-ordinator. Contact details for each are in the District Directory.

The GMT Co-ordinator is Lion Pauline McCreanor of Ryde Lions Club who holds regular meetings to develop strategies to encourage membership growth, maintain the health of clubs, recognise success and address regional growth and development needs.

The GMT's responsibilities also include setting membership and retention goals, motivating Clubs to develop membership and extension plans, communicating successful membership techniques and working closely with the Global Leadership Team (GLT) to enhance training in leadership roles with workshops and seminars.

Following a weekend training workshop in April last year, seven senior Lions spread throughout the District were appointed 'Certified Guiding Lions'. These are all members of the GMT/GLT and their roles are to become mentors, coaches, team builders, listeners, communicators and friends to Clubs who need help with membership and retention.

The Guiding Lions are also appointed by the District Governor to become part of new Lions Clubs as they set up giving help and guidance throughout. In the last two years the GMT have purchased a gazebo, set of signature boards a pull-up banner and a feather flag. Together these are more commonly known as 'The Roadshow'. Using this at public events enables clubs to promote themselves in a professional and consistent manner.
