
The DG'S Leader...


Hello Fellow Lions ...



A wonderful opportunity to double your money! Presidents and Secretaries will have received an e-mail outlining how donations to them can be doubled between 15 February and 15 May 15. Between these dates the UK Government will match, pound for pound, all donations made to Sightsavers, up to £2 million. What

will the money be used for? Your donations will be used to support eye care wherever the need is greatest but the matched funds will be used to prevent and treat trachoma in Tanzania. Trachoma is a very painful and debilitating disease which prevents people from leading normal lives and leads to poverty as people cannot work. However, there is an inexpensive treatment using antibiotics, which can cure the condition. Children and adults can then play a full part in their communities and lead normal lives again. Please think about, and make donations, to this very worthwhile cause. Sight is one of the main GST projects and this could be a major way of your Club helping prevent blindness.

March is, of course, Convention time and I will be in Weymouth. There will be stands on both GST and Community projects. If your Club has a project in these areas that you would like to make known to others, then please send me details by 15 March. It is important that we do share information as it can inspire others to do the same or similar and thus provide service to their communities. Let me know what you are doing to combatt Diabetes, support the Environment, Childhood Cancer, and Feeding the Hungry as well as Sight. You never know but your project could become a District-wide one in the future.

Lions Clubs supporting the partnership with Marie Curie

Over the past six years, during the Great Daffodil Appeal, Lions Clubs have raised £838,000 which has funded 41,900 hours of local hands-on nursing care at home or in a Marie Curie Hospice.

During 2018, 175 Lions Clubs collected and it would be great to see this increase this year. Collections take place thoughout March and Marie Curie nbeed the support of Lions Clubs.

If a collection isn't for your Club, you could still get involved; some Lions Clubs place collection boxes in their local community. For every £20 collected supports one ohour of local hands-on nursing care for someone with a terminal illness.

Fleet manoeuvres against diabetes

Nearly 100 people took advantage of the free screening assessment that Fleet Lions were



offering recently as part of the international efforts by Lions across the world to combat diabetes. The Lions had been trained to carry out and explain the results of these assessments by Diabetes UK, who now promote the use of this initial questionnaire approach rather

than a 'pin-prick' blood test.

The process involves answering questions about things you can't change such as your age, as well as things you can such as body mass index. These factors are scored into bands of risk with an explanation of what they mean. All participants were given leaflets explaining what action they should take to minimise the risk of contracting diabetes.

Organiser Lion Mark Cooper explained that more than 50 per cent of those assessed had a one in seven, or higher, chance of developing diabetes in the next ten years. Some had a one in three chance. A number of people who were invited to be assessed advised that they were already diabetic. The Fleet results indicate what a considerable issue we face with diabetes in this country.


And finally...

New members are vital to the survival of Lions Clubs

New members provide fresh blood and ideas to your Club and new members themselves can bring additional new members to their Clubs.

At the start of the Lion's year, I set a challenge for each Club to bring in three new members during the year. As at the end of January 2019, 22 Clubs in the District have inducted two or more members - a great achievement.

We have four months left in the Lions year and I would encourage all Clubs to continue with their push to find new members. Consider trying one of the following approaches:



- Consider using Lion Ken's "Back to Basics" concept by inviting friends and contacts to a local social meeting to explain more about Lions; and
- Hold an Awards evening at which you can acknowledge local charities and causes that you have supported and also invite supporters/potential members to see what you have been doing.

Looking to hold a Recruitment campaign?

- Maximise local media for publicising events and also for membership. Not just newspapers and radio but Facebook and other forms of social media can be a great source of obtaining potential members;
- Ensure that you have Lions publicity available at all Lions event. There is some really good membership material available for MD HQ in Birmingham - in particular #LionsGetInvolved - is a really good marketing document for the promotion of Lions;
- Now is a good time to start planning a membership activity ahead of your Lions summer activities. However, do not rush the timing, ensure that any event is properly planned and give sufficient timing to publicise the event.
- In terms of the event itself, make it a social evening with plenty of time for your members to talk to those attending on a one-to-one basis. Concentrate on the service and social activities that your Club does in its local community and how Lions make a difference.

Please remember that there is District funding is available for smaller Clubs who wish to run membership recruitment campaigns.

Support is available from the GMT team and your Zone to assist with membership activities.
