## The Lions are let loose in the City of London.



Following months of planning Lions from District 105 D together with Lions and Leos from Districts 105A, EA & SE were let loose around the streets of London for the Lord Mayors Show on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Saturday in November.

Altogether nearly 60 of us from Clubs in and around London participated to welcome in the new Lord Mayor of London Alderman David Wooton in a prestigious parade of military, civic, commercial and voluntary organisations.

The iconic Lions Globe Balloon with the Lions contingent was clearly visible just behind past Olympians being interviewed outside the Mansion House during the live BBC1 coverage of the event. Hundreds of thousands of people lined the route, 10 deep in places to cheer and encourage all who took part throughout the 3 mile route. This magnificent spectacle with its 800 year history comprised of over 6,000 participants including 1,200 children, 20 marching bands, 500 animals, and 43 charity organisations.
