The Business Sessions will run from 9.30am through to 5pm and include the opportunity to attend two Workshops designed to allow Lions the opportunity to help shape how our Clubs will celebrate the fast approaching Centenary celebrations. There are 5 Resolutions to be debated and a choice of whom to elect as the incoming 2<sup>nd</sup> Vice District Governor. Full details are on our District website – please remember there is to be no published Convention Book from this year onwards; if you require copies of specific elements of the Book remember to bring your own copy with you. Details of the Nominations and Resolutions will be displayed on the screens in the Hall.



The social aspects of the weekend, in addition to the opportunity to meet up with old friends and to make new ones, centre around Friday and Saturday evening. Friday evening will be a relaxed evening of entertainment courtesy of the singer, Lisa Faye, and a 2 course meal. Lisa will sing songs from various Musicals and in the first set it will involve a cabaret style as Lisa moves among the tables, whilst the second set will be for dancing the evening away.

Please dress up as a character from a musical – choose your own favourite – as this will add to the atmosphere of the evening; otherwise smart casual attire, please. Saturday night is the Banquet and

Ball with music provided by the band 'WHY' – and I will ensure the formalities are kept to a minimum. The aim for both evenings is to provide a relaxing and entertaining experience.

In the first week of February I was able to attend a Prostate Cancer Screening in Reading – organised by the Lions Clubs of Reading and Woodley and Earley. Such events are attracting a great deal of publicity and attendance – this is the second Screening I am aware of in the District this Lionistic year with at least one more to follow. When I left Reading the number of men who had registered for a test exceeded 360; I was also one of those who felt such an opportunity to be tested was not one to be missed.

The floods and high winds throughout the country have dominated the news over the last couple of months and our travels around the District have seen many flooded fields, damaged trees and a fair amount of water on the roads. I hope that those Lions directly affected by this weather are coping with the difficulties and not finding it all too much of a strain. I would like to thank those Clubs and individual Lions who have responded to pleas for help; these have included providing assistance for individual families who have requested help and in at least one area, helping to 'man' the telephones at a local call centre set up to coordinate help.

At the same time I extend my thanks to all those Clubs who have responded, or who are planning to respond to the Multiple District Disaster Appeal. As usual the Clubs in 105D have donated in a magnificent way to this Appeal. As you will be aware the Appeal needs further funds so that the Trustees can respond immediately and positively when there is a Disaster within our own Multiple District. I know that within 12 hours of receiving an appeal for funds last month from District 105SW to assist those in difficulties in the Somerset Levels the Trustees had committed £10000. It is anticipated much of this money will be used for vulnerable families and groups, especially when the floods eventually subside and it is a case of Lions helping families to dry out properties, redecorating and replacing damaged items.
