“Teamwork, Leadership and Compassion”

You will have heard the phrase 'going into transition' – this means that we have gone below either 35 clubs or 1,250 members – as I write this on 20 June we are at just 1,252 members, so with the usual June clearout I estimate we will be in transition by the time my year of office starts.

What does it mean?

Officially if LCI wanted to brandish the big stick they could appoint future District Governors for the District; as it stands currently this District would not be able to put forward a candidate for International Director if we went into transition. But what is more likely to affect you all is that LCI will not pay a contribution for the partners of the DGE to go to the International Convention – instead the MD picks up this cost by resolution many years ago and this could mean an increase in MD subs as next year the convention is in Hawaii, followed in 2016 by Japan. The more Districts in this MD that we have in transition means more money has to come out of MD funds to support our District Governor and partner. Going to International Convention and DGE Seminar is not a jolly, it is the last link in the chain on top of the training received at MD level to equip you for the job in hand. As always any funding received from LCI or MD is not total re-imbursement but a 'contribution towards' – for example I get an allowance from LCI of just £25 per day towards the cost of breakfast, lunch and dinner in Toronto, those who may have been there will know that will not go far.

So if we do slip into transition by 1 July I want us all to pull together and get out of it as soon as possible afterwards and stay out of it from then on. I05EA did it last year by starting a Campus Club and a Special Interest club; with enthusiasm, a will to succeed and team spirit then I05D could achieve the same result.

Structure – Club Development Specialists and Zone Chairmen

I have strengthened the Global Membership Team by the introduction of Club Development Specialists – one for each Region plus a District wide lead. This team will work under the leadership of the GMT lead Lion Pauline McCreanor who will have responsibility for not only identifying possible areas for new clubs but also helping those Clubs who ask for help in membership related issues. I have chosen very experienced Lions for these roles and they are there to assist – please use them. First VDG Alan Chapman will overview the whole Club Development Team activity which includes the Global Leadership Team and also the PRO. ↓

Next year the Tour de France!

A GROUP of eight Meon Valley Lions recently took part in the charity "Horse or Bike" ride, organised by the New Forest Rotary Club. The event attracted more than 300 entrants, who had the option of cycling, walking or horseback as their preferred mode of transport. Starting at Burley, riders had a choice of mainly off-road routes through the New Forest, enjoying some of Britain's most beautiful countryside en-route. With a lovely day and excellent organisation it proved highly enjoyable, allowing the participants to raise a great deal of money for a variety of chosen charities.

Meon Valley Lions chose to direct their bike-ride sponsorship efforts towards The Rose Road Association, based in Southampton. Established in 1952, The Rose Road Association works with over 400 children, young people and their families from across Hampshire and the surrounding counties. The young people who come to Rose Road have a range of disabilities including severe and profound learning difficulties, physical disabilities and autism. This can lead to health problems linked to respiration, digestion, epilepsy and sensory impairments affecting sight, hearing and touch, as well as speech and ways to communicate. They're a really great bunch and the people who work for Rose Road do a fantastic job helping them to bring out their talents and realise their dreams and aspirations. The group is funded entirely by charitable donations, so we were pleased that our biking efforts contributed a much-needed £1,200 towards their future equipment needs and running costs.


Charters

The District Governor is required to give precedence to 25th and 50th Charter Anniversaries and, while I have already accepted some 50th Anniversary Charters I am sure there may be more plus some 25th anniversaries so please email me and let me know the date as soon as possible so that I can get it in my diary if you wish me to attend. Please remember that a club charter is a CLUB event and therefore it is the Club that makes the decisions on the format, etc. If it is an evening event and you don't want me to wear a white jacket then please tell me when you book me; I am more than happy to keep the jacket out of the cleaners by wearing black. I would also encourage you to consider inviting your Zone Chairman as your guest and to respond to the toast to LCI; when I was first appointed a Zone Chairman in 1991 I was the principal guest at three or more Charters and found the experience of responding to the toast invaluable as I progressed through the Lions hierarchy.

Our man in a Lion suit took a few trips around the local Waitrose, Asda and shops surprising a few people and drumming up more customers.

A simple pot you place in the fridge contains medical information and personal details of a patient leading to safer and speedier First Aid by first responders short cutting time consuming fact-finding enquiries about the patients. GMS Lions recently spent an evening preparing "Message in a Bottle" containers and loading them into dispensers for distribution to local medical centres, dentists and pharmacies.
